Dear Ogden Residents,

It's hard to believe that nine months have passed since I began serving as your mayor. This time has been incredibly fulfilling, and I am grateful for the trust you've placed in me to lead this great city. Together, we have laid the foundation for an exciting future.

One of my primary focuses has been on the internal culture of our city staff. It's essential that the values we identified in my 100-day plan—such as accountability, integrity, service, and community—are reflected in everything we do. We've worked hard to instill these principles across all departments, ensuring that our service to you is rooted in these core values.

At the same time, my administration inherited a significant load of unfinished projects. These responsibilities are enormous, and leaving these projects incomplete would have devastating financial and legal consequences for our city and our people. Addressing these projects has been a major priority, and the weight they carry is something I feel deeply every day. We are committed to finishing them with the level of attention and care they deserve, ensuring that we safeguard Ogden's future.

Let me highlight a few of these major projects.

The Marshall White Center is one of the cornerstones of our community, providing a space for residents of all ages to gather, recreate, and connect. Rebuilding this center has required a thoughtful approach, ensuring that it meets the growing needs of our diverse population. This project is complex, but its importance to the community cannot be overstated. We are determined to deliver a facility that is inclusive, accessible, and built to serve the needs of future generations.

The canyon waterline project is another example of our long-term commitment to securing Ogden's future. This critical infrastructure project ensures a reliable water supply, replacing aging pipelines and modernizing our systems. Coordinating such an undertaking has been incredibly complex, requiring collaboration across departments and between the city and contractors. However, safeguarding our water resources is essential, and we are dedicated to getting it right.

The WonderBlock project represents a significant investment in the future of downtown Ogden. This transformative development will provide a vibrant mix of housing, business, and public spaces that will energize the heart of our city. The scope of this project is enormous, and it requires careful planning and partnership to ensure that it reflects our vision for a thriving and dynamic downtown.

Additionally, our **airport** has undergone significant transformation. When I took office, we were locked in numerous lawsuits with stakeholders, and the conflict between

users and the city was at an all-time high. Today, we've developed a community-driven dynamic. We're listening to stakeholders through advisory groups, using their input to shape policies that not only ensure their success but also the success of our city and its residents.

We are an administration that listens. We want to empower our residents and stakeholders to succeed, and we're committed to responding based on what people tell us they need—not based on what we think they need. This collaborative approach is working at the airport, where we are developing new policies that benefit everyone. Our commercial flight service is a success, paying off financially for the city and providing opportunities for Ogden families to travel easily and affordably. We're also nearing the celebration of an **\$18-million FAA grant to build a brand-new air traffic control tower**—one of the few such projects in the country. This tower will serve our city for generations, and it's a testament to what we can achieve when we work together. Terminal upgrades are also on the horizon, supported by federal grants and partnerships that haven't existed at the airport in years.

I'm also committed to continue delivering on campaign promises that improve our internal processes and benefit our community. In the coming months, our citizen reporting portal, **3-1-1**, will be up and running and will compliment our new online **AI chatbot, "Archie"**, that is launching in early December. Citizens will be able to easily find information or report issues via the bot, or by texting the hotline.

Of course, we've also had missteps and challenges, and I don't want to hide from them. One of the hardest issues I've inherited is **paid parking downtown**. Public engagement on this matter has been mixed—successful in some ways, but lacking in others. While some decisions about parking were made before I took office and can't be undone, it is my responsibility to make those decisions work as best as possible.

We've heard tremendous pushback from 25th Street business owners about **paid parking**, but we've also heard frustration from other downtown business owners regarding parking shortages. It's clear we have parking issues, and most people agree we need a solution. However, how we address it moving forward is still to be determined. I've taken responsibility for the decisions made, like a leader should, and I'm committed to getting it right—no matter how long it takes. This process, though tough, is a reflection of both leadership and humility. Yet, at times, I feel like people can be quick to criticize, often before the work is finished. We need to approach these challenges with patience and an understanding that thoughtful solutions take time.

Another challenge has been the situation with **144 25th Street**, a building that was torn down during the last administration because it was unsafe. While the previous

administration's approval for development still stands, I've focused my efforts on making sure small improvements are made to help the new project fit within the historical context of 25th Street. Most importantly, I'm committed to ensuring that whatever is built on that site is done safely and responsibly.

In addition to these projects, we are making significant improvements to our **internal processes**. We have initiated a comprehensive review of our building, business, and licensing code services to streamline and enhance these critical services for our residents and businesses. We are also consolidating and prioritizing our communications efforts to ensure that information flows more effectively both within the city and with our community. Our focus on community engagement is ongoing, and we are creating new ways for you to be involved in the decision-making processes that shape our city. A prime opportunity for you to engage in shaping Ogden's future is to participate in ongoing **Plan Ogden** meetings which helps to inform decisions within our general plan update. Additionally, we are building a new constituent services apparatus to provide better, more responsive support to residents.

As mayor, my role is to lead both internally and externally. I listen to the needs of the people, and my job is to ensure that we align our resources to meet those needs. Leadership for me means serving first—servant leadership that prioritizes the well-being of our community. While we've never been perfect, and we never will be, we should always be in pursuit of greatness, striving to make this city the best it can be.

Part of this effort has included hiring great leaders who share this vision. In recent months, we've brought on exceptional talent, including our new **CED Director, CED Deputy Director, Public Works Director, Police Chief, Deputy Police Chief, City Engineer, and Airport Director**. Each of these individuals is deeply committed to ensuring that Ogden thrives, and their leadership will help guide us as we continue to grow and evolve.

We are an administration that listens, that serves, and does so collaboratively. We don't always get it right, but when we don't, we accept our role and redouble our efforts to get it right. The world needs more humility, and if humility were met with grace, we'd see more of it from our leaders.

I want to thank each of you for your continued support and commitment to our community. These nine months have been just the beginning, and I look forward to all that we will accomplish together.

STREET OGDEN PRESENTS HISTORIC PROFILE

“Where the Past meets the Present and the Future is NOW!”



Two kids from Ogden; National Champions and Champions in Life

Wat Misaka was an Ogden kid born and raised. He had a humble existence and an unassuming personality that when combined with a drive to excel and achieve excellence propelled him unknowingly, to change the complexion of the National Basketball Association forever.

Earl Lloyd was the first African American to play in the league. He did so in 1950 when he was drafted by the Washington Capitols, an early entry into the fledgling NBA. In 1947 however, the New York Nickerbockers took a chance and drafted the 5 foot 7 inch defensive specialist Watru Misaka from Ogden by way of the University of Utah in the 7th round. He was the first person of minority descent to play in the NBA and opened the door and paved the way for greater racial acceptance in the league a full seven months before Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier in Major League Baseball.

Wat didn't start out planning to change the way society looks at racial diversity, he was just a kid doing what he loved, playing sports. In fact it wasn't til years after is playing career ended that he realized he was a trail blazer and a pioneer in professional sports.

His first attempts at athletics were when he set up a high jump bar in an alleyway behind his fathers barbershop. Then at Central Junior High where he played basketball and football and then on to Ogden High School where he played baseball, was the captain of the football team, ran track and played basketball. With Wat leading the way, Ogden won the State Championship in basketball in 1940. Wat attended Weber Junior College for two years and led the team to two Conference Championships.

Being an outstanding student and wanting to pursue a degree in engineering he enrolled at the University of Utah in 1943, a decision that would have a lasting impact on how we view sport, society and culture

today.

It was at the "U" as a junior that he would team up with another Ogdenite, a 6'4" freshman named Arnie Ferrin who along with seven other walk-ons would change the course of the University Athletics Program for the next four years and what they accomplished would be remembered and talked about for decades.

Racial intolerance was not new to Wat. Having grown up on lower 25th Street in Ogden in the dugout basement of his father's barbershop he was accustomed to hearing passersby shout racial epithets. He was frequently refused admittance to shops and restaurants because of his race but being aware of the Japanese principle Shikata ga nai a term that means "nothing can be done about it, or, it cannot be helped," he grew up accepting the hand life had dealt him.

With the onset of World War 2 and the bombing of Pearl Harbor things took a darker tone for many Japanese Americans including Wat. While 120,000 of his Japanese countrymen were locked away in internment camps scattered in remote areas of the U.S., Wat was running free, back and forth on the hardwoods playing basketball, a fact that angered many of his opponents and their fans.

Due to gas rationing during the war many of the Universities in the old Skyline Conference dropped their athletic programs. The University of Utah, however decided to continue theirs primarily to refocus the attention of their supporters away from the sadness of war to something positive and exciting like college sports.

Without conference teams to play, the "U" scheduled mostly semipro and military teams throughout the Intermountain West. For the military teams, playing Utah, with a Japanese American on the floor was more about pummeling the enemy and less about a competitive game of basketball. Calls of "go home Jap" and others resound-

ed frequently from the stands when Wat was on the floor. Angered by the constant verbal abuse by fans Arnie and the other teammates promised to do all they could to protect Wat and have his back if there was trouble.


During the 1944 season the Army requisitioned the Einar Nielson Fieldhouse where the team was to practice and play their home games. It suddenly became a barracks for the military students on campus. Practices were rescheduled for the girls gym and all games were on the road. For a team with no home court the team ended up with a glossy 22-4 record.

Following the season the team had a bid to play in the NCAA Tournament and also the National Invitation Tournament. The NIT was to be played in New York City at Madison Square Garden and the NCAA would have the regionals in Kansas City. The team voted to accept the bid to the NIT since only two players on the team had been out of the state of Utah and the players wanted to see New York before they went off to serve in the military.

After losing in the first round of the NIT, the team was headed home when they received a call to replace the University of Arkansas, who was unable to accept their bid in the NCAA Tournament. Utah traveled to Kansas, won the Western Regionals and traveled back to New York to play in the NCAA Championship game against Dartmouth College a heavy favorite to beat the team from Utah who started four freshmen. In the first overtime game in NCAA Championship history Utah won 42-40.

For his efforts scoring 22 points, half of his team's total, Arnie was named the most outstanding player in the tournament. He was the first freshman ever to be so honored and one of only handful to be named since.

Wat's outstanding play caught the eye of Ned Irish, the president of the New York Nickerbockers who, upon Wat's grad-



uation four years later, drafted him in 7th round.

Arnie and Wat had been room mates for the year and became fast friends. While Wat was raised in the tough part of town where wino's slept in alleyways and prostitutes walked the sidewalks, Arnie was raised on the east bench of Ogden with a loving family to care for and nurture him. Although they both had stellar Jr. high and high school careers, they never met until that day they walked into the girls gym at the University of Utah, just hoping to try out for the team that would eventually become the unlikely National Champions.

In an unintentional portrayal of their friendship, when awards were being handed out to the players of the winning team, Arnie slipped on Wat's warm up jacket and Wat inadvertently slipped on Arnie's. With the sleeves hanging over his hands, Wat was handed his award while Arnie, with the sleeves up near his elbows, waited for his. Just two kids from Ogden with so much that could separate them overcoming it all to become life long friends.

When the team returned to Salt Lake City, Wat was met at the train by his mother who handed him his induction papers. He served for two years in the Army and, at one point, was stationed in Hiroshima interviewing survivors of the atomic bomb. He once said that in America he was viewed as the enemy and in Japan he was viewed as a traitor.

Arnie, being two years younger than Wat, returned to the "U" until he was drafted by the Army. Because he had been in the ROTC in high school he was given the opportunity to apply for Officer Candidate School. However the war was winding down and he was released from his military obligation.

The two met up again two years later at the "U" and in 1947 led the team to the NIT Championship beating the heavily

favored University of Kentucky team.

Arnie was named All American all four years in college. He was drafted by the Lakers and played as a starting guard for three years winning two World Championships. He served as the General Manager of the Utah Stars of the American Basketball Association. He was the Athletic Director at the University of Utah a position he held until his retirement. He was elected to the College Basketball Hall of Fame in 2008. He passed away on December 27th, 2022 at the age of 97.

When Wat's professional basketball days were over he returned to Utah to begin his career in engineering. He worked most of his career at Sperry and upon retiring, continued to work without pay, for a friend who had a business that needed his expertise. Wat was honored by the New York Nicks on May 11, 2022 for his contribution to the sport of basketball and was honored by President Obama in 2009.

Arnie and Wat were friends in the deepest sense of the word. They often played golf together and attended social events with their wives. As they relied on each other as teammates on the court, they relied on each other in old age as well frequently talking on the phone and checking in on each other. Upon learning from his doctor that he only had a few days to live, Wat was handed his phone and called Arnie to say goodbye.


In honor of the accomplishments of both the 1944 and the 1947 teams, the University commissioned a **bas** relief sculpture showing Wat passing the ball to Arnie, who's arms were stretched out to receive the pass. It rested above the entry way in the Einar Nielson Fieldhouse until it was removed for building renovations, and carefully placed outside until it could be reinstalled. A unexpected rain storm came along drenching the plaster sculpture until it dissolved into tiny white rivulets, which ran

down and away into the grass. Like the 44 and 47 teams, the sculpture is mostly forgotten except by those old enough to remember it. Occasionally someone will pick up a book or an old news paper and remember what these kids did to accomplish what most at the time thought was impossible.

Both Arnie and Wat have had their jerseys retired by the University and they hang together, side by side, in the rafters of the Huntsman Center on the Campus, together, not only representing their athletic achievements but a friendship that lasted a lifetime.

and swept with the souls of the past.


May the broken thread continue to be woven

It will.


Awake be the Cornerstone

Union Station Neighborhood Community Plan

Union Station is an Ogden staple, located at 2501 Wall Avenue in downtown Ogden. The building recently celebrated 100 years of operation. If you haven't already heard, Union Station has a one-way ticket to renovation and redevelopment. It's not just the station itself getting a facelift, but the surrounding land as well. Updating the historical Union Station has been in development since 2019, as part of Ogden's Master Plan. It was approved in 2020 by the City Council. Beforehand, the last Master Plan for Ogden was in 2007.

Discussions between locals and the City Council over those years included the recommendation that Union Station should be restored and the land surrounding the building be redeveloped. Locals have wanted to see better uses for the land. From this recommendation stems the Union Station Area Plan. Created in 2021, this proposal details their expected land use and zoning, the flexibility of parking, transit, and pedestrian usage, and their implementation process. There will be better parking structures, living zones, open and

mixed-use spaces, and more. In 2022, the Union Station Campus Development Framework Plan was created. This plan was built off the previous area plan, and it specifies that this development will span a total of 29.6 acres.

The community has been voicing their concerns and ideas in community conversations. One point that is brought up in all these proposals is the desire for this project to connect to the existing framework of downtown Ogden, while simultaneously making it possible for expansion in later years. In the development framework plan, one section reads, "Redevelopment of the Union Station campus should feel like an extension of the existing downtown framework." One example of this statement in their planning includes the connection of pedestrian travel throughout the entire development, with plaza spaces for people to mingle. There are plenty of concept photos to give locals an idea of what Union Station and the surrounding area will look like.


This project is going to be handled by McWhinney, J. Fisher Companies, Mortenson, and Design Workshop. It will

be in the planning phases until February 2025. After, the development package will go to the City for approval. J. Fisher Companies is also a developer for Make Ogden's WonderBlock, which is another large project happening on 26th Street between Grant and Lincoln Avenues.

How can you get involved? To make it easier for the public to access information about this large project, there is a website. Search 'Union Station Neighborhood Community' and it should be the first link. Below the community conversation section, there is a slideshow titled "Union Station Neighborhood: How did we get here?" where all the above information and more is located. The slides are a step-by-step history of the planning of this project, and links are included to direct the reader toward PDFs of the plans. 
LENE' MARIE CHOCOLATES

HISTORY OF OGDEN CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS

OGDEN CITY – CHRISTMAS VILLAGE AND ELECTRIC LIGHT PARADE HISTORY

In 1961, I have a letter from the Chamber of Commerce (Chairman Len Allen at the time) thanking Ogden City for their assistance with the Christmas Holiday Parade.

As early as 1962, discussions were ongoing about the "Christmas Display in MISSILE Park". It was organized by the Retail Merchants Division of the Chamber of Commerce to develop a gigantic parade and display of animated units. The display was to be added to each year and was expected (even at that time) to receive international publicity. At that time, the retailers and industry people had raised approximately \$20,000 and the City and County had not contributed to this effort. However, discovery was made there was no power available to light the decorations in the park and operate the animated units. It required some 63,000 watts to handle the operation, including a central missile Christmas tree with three revolving colors which alone took 18,000 to 20,000 watts. In 1962, the buildings from the park were actually entries in the holiday parade; such was accomplished by them being mounted on trucks for the Christmas parade on the morning after Thanksgiving. They were then installed in the Missile Park and that evening there was to be a ceremony for the lighting of the display. There was to be a little radio station among the units from which broadcasts were made each day; it was hoped the City would achieve national publicity because it would be something new and outstanding.

In both 1972 and 1973, the Greater Ogden Chamber of Commerce was still in charge of the annual Christmas parade; they indicated it would travel from 21st to 27th Streets along Washington Boulevard at 10:00 a.m. on the Saturday prior to Thanksgiving. About 1972, requests from food vendors and a helium balloon vendor were made to set up booths along the parade route. These were subsequently denied.

In 1975, discussion took place between the Greater Ogden Chamber of Commerce and the Ogden City Council regarding the annual Christmas Parade and the possibility of moving it to after Thanksgiving. It was a highly debated topic, and the item was tabled. One week later, the Council approved the parade to be continued to be held the Saturday before Thanksgiving. Reasoning was given that if the annual Christmas parade were held on the Saturday after Thanksgiving, there would be no way members of local school bands could be required to appear in the parade because the majority would be out of town with their families. At

that time, the suggestion was made by James Thompson, Supervisor of Music Ogden City Schools, for the City to give consideration to changing the nature of the parade for future years and holding a holiday parade which would call attention not only to Christmas, but to Thanksgiving as well. Great debate took place, after which a committee was established to review this annual event. This committee was comprised of retail merchants, Greater Ogden Chamber of Commerce members, members of the City Council, and citizens.

In 1976, the parade still took place at 10:00 a.m. on the Saturday prior to Thanksgiving. As of 1980, the parade was conducted at 2 p.m. in the afternoon of the Saturday before Thanksgiving. The Ogden City Christmas Village Advisory Committee was created in 1983; their first meeting held on a Tuesday, September 27, 1983. Wynn Covieo was the Chairman and Lisa Hult, Vice-Chair. The Committee at that time reported they were interested in upgrading the village and making the public more aware of it; however, timing to do so was an issue that first year. They recommended at that time that the lighting of Christmas Village be coordinated with a ceremony and program. They suggested having local community groups perform; including media coverage, and having the Mayor throw the switch to light the village. The Committee also recommended the traditional Christmas parade be held later in the afternoon so the lighting of the village could be coordinated with the parade.

That same year, it was decided that the Christmas Parade would begin at 3:00 p.m. and would run south on Washington Boulevard from 22nd Street to 25th Street and then west on 25th Street to Grant Avenue. With these changes in the parade's time and route, it was able to tie into the lighting of the park ceremonies. The parade ended on 25th Street with a ribbon cutting ceremony, bands and choirs, and was done in connection with the lights being turned on.

In 1986, the Greater Downtown Ogden Association sent notice to the City Council of cancellation of the Christmas Parade in effort to spend the budget funding to update Christmas Village. By 1987, there were 43 entries in the parade; it took place the day after Thanksgiving at 4:30 p.m. with the Christmas Village Opening Gala immediately following at approximately 5:30 p.m. A Christmas Design Plan was unveiled at that time from the Business Development Department through the Downtown Ogden Association. The Plan is detailed but included lighting the trees along Washington Boulevard between 22nd and 27th Streets and various phases to achieve a seasonal difference with banners and an overall package. This included the Christmas Parade to be tied in with the lighting of all the lights and Santa Claus coming to Christmas Village.

In 1988 and 1989, the parade was held on the Saturday after Thanksgiving at 5:00 p.m. It would appear that an annual theme for the event began around this time as well. Christmas Village had stagnated and there had not been a lot of improvements made for several years. In 2002, a new chairperson, Jo Packham, was appointed by Mayor Godfrey. Ms. Packham is

a local business owner and the past president of the Historic 25 Association. She was able to get numerous businesses involved in Christmas Village with both cash and in-kind donations. She also involved volunteer groups and organizations. The result has been the refurbishing of many of the old cottages and donation of many new cottages. The quality of the village improved tremendously. The Village has consistently added new cottages and new sponsors. Each year the Village is better than the previous.

In 2023, we now have 64 cottages.

Christmas Village and Holiday Parade

It was a crisp December day in 1961. Jerry and Maxine Green and their 5-year-old son, Tommy, were standing in the most perfect spot of all for the big Christmas parade. Warmed by their growing anticipation, they eagerly looked for the parade to come. Then suddenly it began with the screaming sirens of the police cars. A big flatbed truck rushed by with Santa Claus waving to the hundreds of children who came to see him. And that was it. That was the end of the Christmas Parade. Tommy's disappointment was overwhelming and Jerry Green knew something had to be done, but what? After many sleepless hours that cold winter night, Jerry Green came up with an idea. An incredible vision! It was that of a "Christmas Village" that would have all of the toy and candy shops you would find at Santa's North Pole home as well as a really big and wonderful Santa Claus Parade. Jerry Green knew the idea was good, but he was worried about how to make it happen. The original cost estimate for this venture was a whopping \$25,000. It was with great trepidation that he approached the town merchants. The response was immediate and enthusiastic. In a matter of weeks, the merchants were out seeking pledges for the village idea. Utah Power and Light pledged to donate the electricity for the lights. Merchants donated materials and it seemed that everyone in the city was pitching in with the construction of the village. On November 23, 1962 the very first Christmas Village and Parade opened Ogden's holiday season. Those involved with the first Christmas Village hoped that it would continue on through the generations, bringing joy to all those who come to visit.

This hope is alive and well today and carried on by a dedicated Christmas Village Committee. It is their goal to continue this wonderful tradition by expanding, improving and refurbishing the winter fantasyland displays.

Our wish is that you and your families make this a wonderful part of your Christmas traditions.

Ballet has several physical and mental health benefits. Dancers will gain improved overall physical health while acquiring self-confidence, discipline, enhanced creativity, and socialization skills.

The Nutcracker, presented by Imagine Ballet Theater at Peery's Egyptian Theater will run for a total of five days and seven performances. It is about a young girl named Clara who is gifted a nutcracker for Christmas and pulled into a magical night. Lobby doors open

one hour before showtime, and house doors open 30 minutes before showtime. Door times are subject to change. Special notes for the performances mention that all sales are final, no babes in arms are allowed, and all people ages 2+ may attend. Ticket prices begin at \$18 each and increase for seating closest to the stage at \$32 each. Some dates have matinee performances for those unable to attend evening shows. WINTER OLYMPICS 2034 COMES BACK TO UTAH

HOW IT IMPACTS OGDEN

Get ready, Utah, because the countdown to the 2034 Winter Olympics is set to take place from February 10-26, 2034. On July 24, 2024, the International Olympic Committee announced that Salt Lake City will host the 2034 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games. On that day, the IOC President, Thomas Bach, said, "Salt Lake City and Utah are long-time friends of the Olympic Movement, and we are confident that they will organize exceptional Olympic and Paralympic Games, just as they did years ago. The legacy of 2002 is tangibly and passionately alive in Utah. The legacy of 2034 starts today." Research on the economic impact the Olympics will have in Utah has already been conducted.

According to a report by John C. Downen, a Senior Research Fellow in the David Eccles School of Business at the University of Utah, the "Cumula-

tive estimated state fiscal impacts from 2024 through 2035 include new state revenues of \$167.2 million (in 2023 dollars) and expenditures of \$146.2 million, for net fiscal revenues of \$21.0 million. Estimated local fiscal impacts comprise \$138.1 million in new revenues and \$108.8 million in expenditures, for net local revenues of \$29.3 million." More jobs will be available from now until the Olympics arrive, creating 12 job-years for each person employed for the purpose of the winter games. The same report states that this will create a total of over 42,000 job-years. 
Ogden is approximately 38 miles from Salt Lake City, and 70 miles from Park City, where most of the events and tourists will be located. How is Ogden impacted by this grand event?

The last time Salt Lake City hosted the Winter Olympics was in 2002. Here in Ogden, Snowbasin hosted the Downhill, Super-G, and combined races. The previous Winter Olympic infrastructure still stands and functions in great condition, which is likely a large factor in Utah being selected to host again.

Snowbasin has a page dedicated to their participation in the upcoming Olympics. On this page, they proudly declare that "Snowbasin Resort is one of only three resorts in North America to offer start-to-finish skiing on a downhill Olympic trail... The resort recently added or upgraded five chairlifts, built multiple restaurants and improved infrastructure through snowmaking installations and renovations, parking expansion and new restrooms." Along with these improvements, Snowbasin claims that many Ogden locals have been calling to sign up as volunteers for the event. This is not surprising; the 2002 Olym-

pics brought in 26,000 volunteers across the entire event.

This is only the beginning of the true impact the 2034 Winter Olympics will create in Utah and Ogden. For now, information is limited. As years pass and the host year approaches, information will continue to grow. 



Angelica Brewer ogdens' poet laureate scholarship recipient

Ogden's art community provides a variety of artistic expression. One form of expression is poetry, and our City Poet Laureate recently received a fellowship award and national recognition. A poet laureate is an ambassador for poetry, art, and literary events/projects over the city, state, or country in which they live. For Ogden, the poet serves a 2-year term, with the option to run for a second term. While serving as City Poet Laureate, the poet will participate in public events, such as city meetings and ceremonies, to read their own work or the work of another poet. They also generally promote literary efforts in schools and the community. Ogden has had three poets laureate total, as the position officially began in 2016: Brad Roghaar, Abraham Smith, and now Angelika Brewer.

Angelika Brewer is 27 years old. She's a poet, writer, public speaker, and artistic enthusiast. She has spoken at several public events about how she has received no formal training for her prose; instead, she was encouraged to be

creative since she was a child by her then teen mother and her near-blind grandmother. This encouragement bloomed into the active role she has taken as Ogden's Poet Laureate. She has been a featured speaker at reading, art, and literary festivals, workshops, and competitions across the state. Brewer was at the Union Station 100-year time capsule unveiling in May of this year, where she read the 1888 cornerstone ceremony poem as well as a poem of her own. Other than public speaking, she has created a community art project that has been thriving in Ogden.

Brewer initiated the Ogden Ar(t)chives Mailbox in February of 2023. Situated downtown, this mailbox is open to public art submissions. If it fits in the mailbox, the community is welcome to submit their art. The pieces can be anonymous or signed. The art is then posted onto social media or entered into a yearly art exhibit. Submissions are archived in city records. Angelika Brewer's work as Ogden's Poet Laureate awarded her \$50,000 from the Academy of American Poets.



The \$50,000 fellowship is intended to be a resource for local, municipal, and state poets laureate to create new work and continue their undertaking in impactful literary projects. Brewer states that 15% of the fellowship funds is requested to be dedicated to these projects. According to the Academy of American Poets, Brewer will utilize the funds to expand the Ogden Ar(t)chives Mailbox to include digitization of the archives. She also plans to offer children the opportunity to be published through a local publisher.

VOTE VOTE VOTE

The 2024 General Election is coming up on Tuesday, November 5th. While some people may have already researched and decided how they are going to vote, there may be just as many who remain undecided. Many factors can make wanting to vote feel difficult. Common factors include not knowing how to register, feeling uninformed on the issues, uncertainty of deadlines, and more. It is important to understand what candidates stand for on certain issues, as well as what initiatives may be on a ballot measure. The outcomes of each election affect the lives of everyone across the county, state, and country.

Vote411.org is a website run by the League of Women Voters. You can register to vote, get personalized voting information such as registration status and local polling locations, search voting information by state, and make a voting plan. This information is on the homepage. Creating a personalized voter information page requires an address. The next page displays upcoming elections, such as the General Election in November. The online and by mail registration deadline is October 25th. The in-person deadline is November 5th.

The races that are displayed in the voters' guide are

based on the address entered. Here, you will find a list of all the races you are eligible to vote for, regardless of if it is nationwide, statewide, or countywide. Selecting a race will provide specific information about candidates, such as links to their campaign websites. These links are where candidates post their stances on issues relevant to their candidacy. The League of Women Voters has asked candidates questions about issues they are addressing. Some of the candidates have answered those questions.

Another other important part of the personal voter information is the Utah Poll Locator. When elections come closer, this map system will show you the closest places to find either a polling location or a ballot drop box. Beneath the map is a list of recordings relevant to your voting eligibility. Finally, there are additional resources containing additional information at the bottom of the page. Any problems or concerns about any election may be reported to the number on Vote411.org's homepage.

While Vote411.org is a great location for information about voting, a vital component of research is viewing information from multiple credible sources. Credible sources hold significant importance beyond research papers; in the context of voting, they form the bedrock of trust upon which well-informed voters can base their decisions.



These four websites are all credible sources to search for any information necessary to be an informed voter. They are operated either by the government or a nonpartisan voting organization.


