# HISTORIC OGDEN HOMES JOHN BROWNING MANSION



## MORE THAN A HOUSE The John M. Browning Mansion

At the corner of 27th Street and Adams Avenue in Ogden stands an imposing red sandstone and brick building. It is not as outwardly spectacular as the nearby Eccles Art Center, nor as impeccably maintained—but not because it was forgotten or unloved. In many ways, the opposite is true. Where one building has been carefully preserved, original features maintained, the John M. Browning Mansion has been lived in, worked in, relied upon. Its weathered exterior is less a sign of neglect than of use. Despite being designed by the same architect, built from the same materials, and established for prominent Ogden families, the two homes have seen very different lives.

This house has watched Ogden grow up around it. It has been a family home, a place of work, a refuge, an afterthought, and—at times—a near-loss. The walls don't just reflect architectural ambition; they hold evidence of care, resilience, and quiet endurance. To me, history doesn't just mean the major, world-changing events; it means realizing how many ordinary lives have leaned on this place in moments of stability and crisis alike. Once you understand that, the building stops being an artifact. It becomes a responsibility.

Constructed between 1890 and 1900, the mansion was built for John Moses Browning, whose innovations in firearms design would go on to shape industries, technologies, and global history. But the house itself was never meant as a monument. It was designed as a home—substantial, well-crafted, and rooted in a growing city that believed in its own future.

The materials and scale speak to confidence and permanence, not opulence. This was a building meant to be used, filled, and inhabited. In that sense, it mirrors Ogden itself at the turn of the century: industrious, ambitious, and deeply tied to the labor that sustained it.

When the Browning family eventually moved on, the house did not retreat into irrelevance. Instead, it adapted—again and again. Over the decades, it was divided into apartments to house soldiers during World War II, and afterward became the headquarters for the Ogden branch of the YWCA.

This chapter is central to why the mansion matters to me. For a time, the same walls that once sheltered a prominent family became a haven for women and children in moments of need. The building shifted its purpose without losing its dignity. It offered safety instead of status, care instead of prestige. During its time as the YWCA, it served as a place to stay, a place to learn, a place to heal, and a place to grow. It filled the roles that were needed, from childcare to healthcare, from a 24/7 crisis hotline and emergency housing to the programming and support women needed to reclaim their independence in a changing world.

That ability to change—to meet people where they were—gave the mansion a deeply personal significance that no plaque could convey. It wasn't preserved because it was famous. It endured because it was useful.

Historic buildings often suffer from a particular misunderstanding: that visible age means neglect. In the case of the Browning Mansion, wear is evidence of meaning. Initials carved in a windowsill, a worn threshold, a handwritten note tucked away for a future reader—these may seem like trivial things, imperfections, but to me they're a way to connect with everyone who has lived here, loved here, and learned here.

These are not flaws to be erased. They are records of presence.

To restore a building like this is not to erase its past, but to stabilize it—to ensure it can continue carrying meaning forward without collapsing under the weight of time.

Caring about this house has changed how I think about preservation. Saving historic places isn't about nostalgia or aesthetics alone. It's about refusing to treat history as disposable. It's about acknowledging that buildings, like people, deserve care when they've given so much of themselves to others.


Today, the John M. Browning Mansion is my home, but it's also so much more than that. That's why my husband and I have created the John M. Browning Mansion nonprofit organization, to facilitate the preservation and restoration of this cornerstone of our community. The goal is not to freeze the house in time, but to return it to the community as a living resource—one that can educate, gather, and inspire.

The mansion has already lived many lives. What comes next depends on whether enough people decide that those lives—and the stories they represent—are worth carrying forward.

Supporting the restoration of the John M. Browning Mansion is not just about saving a building. It's about keeping the stories, the memories, and the meaning alive for generations to come.

This house has done real work for this city. With intention and collective support, it can continue to do so—standing not just as a reminder of the past, but as a promise that some things are still worth keeping.

# BELLE LONDON THE BELL OF THE BALL

## Belle London: Queen of Ogden's Underworld and Self-Proclaimed Reformer

"I am the greatest woman reformer in the world. No woman in the world was ever more wronged in this way than I have been in Utah. When you know me and the grand work of reform I am doing, you will hold me high in your esteem."

With these bold words in 1910, Belle London sought to define her own legacy. Born in 1866 in the small railroad town of Monticello, Illinois, Belle—christened Isabelle—grew up in a crowded, complicated household. Her mother died when she was only ten. Her father soon remarried, and with two sisters already in the family and nine additional children from the second marriage, Belle came of age knowing that opportunities for girls were scarce and survival often depended on grit rather than propriety. That lesson would shape her entire life.

By 1889, Belle arrived in Ogden, Utah, where she was first arrested for prostitution. It was the beginning of a public life that would make her the most powerful and polarizing woman in the Intermountain West. To her defenders, she was a philanthropist and protector of "fallen women."

To her critics, she was the notorious "Queen of the Underworld," a title immortalized by Reverend Elderkin in 1909. Whatever the angle, Belle London left an imprint on Ogden that could not be ignored.

Throughout the 1890s and early 1900s, Belle steadily expanded her influence over Ogden's red-light district, gaining a level of control that extended from politics to policing. Rumors swirled that the police were in her pocket, and in many ways she ran Ogden's vice economy like a seasoned



business executive. She owned considerable property—cribs, houses, businesses in Electric Alley, an ice-cream parlor, and a grand home built for \$10,000, a significant sum at the time. The home would later be sold in 1917 to the Martha Society, a symbolic close to Belle's most powerful era in the city.

But Belle's role as a madam carried darker allegations. She was accused of forcing girls to work in Electric Alley and, in 1908, paid \$660 in fines on behalf of 66 of the women under her charge—a gesture seen alternately as coercion or care, depending on the observer. Yet Belle consistently insisted she was working to "rehabilitate the poor degraded womanhood" of Ogden.

Part of her self-defined mission included sending girls to the State Industrial School (SIS), which functioned as the juvenile detention facility for the entire Intermountain West. However, at the time Belle promoted the school as a refuge, the SIS was under investigation for rampant physical and sexual abuse by its headmaster. Women of Ogden's Child Culture Club spearheaded inquiries into the institution, uncovering disturbing patterns of mistreatment. Belle either denied the allegations or genuinely believed the school was the only alternative to life in the alleys—but her involvement remains one of the most controversial pieces of her reformist claims.

Belle reached the height of her influence during the 1908–1910 debate over the creation of "stockades"—formalized districts meant to contain Ogden and Salt Lake City's sex trade in one regulated area. Salt Lake politicians and law enforcement figures begged for such a system, arguing that it simplified policing and improved health conditions. Under the stockade plan, women working in the district were subject to medical exams every ten days. Belle



supported this structure, insisting it created order. She even claimed that during the stockade's operation, there were no drunks, robberies, or police calls.

With the backing of the Citizens' Investment Company, she put up an astounding \$500,000 to develop property in the proposed zones between 1st and 2nd South and 4th and 5th West. She envisioned even expanding services with a hospital dedicated to the women of the district. But the political tide turned quickly. Reformers gained momentum and public opinion shifted. On March 7, 1910, the stockades were ordered closed. Almost overnight, Belle's empire collapsed. She was arrested soon after, accused of contributing to the downfall of a young woman. Though she was initially convicted, the decision was overturned on appeal. The damage, however, was done.

Stripped of income and influence, Belle returned briefly to Ogden, selling her jewelry and diamonds to survive. Eventually, she moved to San Francisco, where she opened a new hotel and ran a small farm. It was there that her tumultuous life came to an abrupt end in 1925, when she was tragically crushed between two cars. She left behind two adopted daughters, Ethel and Charlotte, and a legacy still debated today.

Belle London remains a paradox: a woman who profited from vice yet insisted she was a reformer; a figure both condemned and admired; a product of limited opportunities who built power in the only arena available to her. Whether viewed as villain or visionary, she undeniably shaped the history of women, work, and power in the American West.

# FORESTRY BUILDING REIMAGINED



## OGDEN REDEVELOPMENT FORESTRY BUILDING: ROOTED IN HISTORY, GROWING A NEW FUTURE

Ogden has always been a hallmark of thoughtful architectural preservation. Long before “adaptive reuse” became a buzzword, the city and community alike have prided themselves in creatively reimagining historic spaces as the needs of our downtown spaces have grown and evolved. Ogden City Planners have focused on keeping the bones, brick, and soul of our buildings intact while giving them a new reason to breathe, and the thoughtful reimagining of the downtown forestry building is no different.

The Forestry Building was constructed on the east side of 25th street between 1933 and 1934 as part of President Roosevelt’s New Deal. It is now slated to be fully adapted to the

needs of the Nine Rails Creative District while still preserving its distinctive Art Deco Style and indispensable history.

The Ogden architectural firm of Hodgson & McClenahan began the project in 1932, while construction began in 1933. Murch Brothers Construction, of St. Louis, Missouri, finished construction in 1934.

The building was originally home to the U.S. Forest Service Intermountain Region, the Experimental Station, and the Supply Depot. It was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2006 and was used by the forest service until 2022. Nearly a century later, the Ogden Forestry Building is being thoughtfully reimagined as a mixed-use space featuring both apartments and art studios. This change supports the larger holistic effort in the nine rails district to foster a central hub for Ogden’s creative and cultural spaces.

Original materials, like the eight shades of brick built into a gradient rising along linear columns, are being preserved, allowing future residents and artists to live inside Ogden’s story as it

is transitioned into a downtown community space. The inclusion of art studios and performing art centers is especially meaningful. Ogden’s creative community has long been the quiet engine behind the city’s resurgence. By pairing housing with dedicated creative workspaces, the Forestry Building aligns with Ogden’s greater efforts to revitalize its community through art and culture.

As the Forestry Building enters its next chapter, it stands as a model for what redevelopment can look like when history, housing, and creativity are allowed to co-exist.



# Louis Moench & Frederick Kiesel: Two Men, Two Visions

Ogden has only one sister city and that is Hof, Germany. A small town of around 40,000 inhabitants, it has been Ogden's sister city since 1954 and was the first German city to have a relationship with a city in the United States after World War II. This connection may seem strange upon first glance but Ogden has deep German roots.

Two German men in particular have created a lasting impact on the city's religious and secular identity that continues to this day.

## Louis F. Moench

The first man, Louis F. Moench, was born in Neuffen, modern-day Germany in the late 1840s. He left Germany for the United States when he was ten years old and trained as a tanner before graduating from Bryant and Stratton College in Chicago. In 1866, he and a fellow graduate were traveling through Utah on their way to California. They were both aspiring teachers and were on their way west to teach college. But, while they were in Salt Lake City, Moench converted to the Church of Jesus

Christ of Latter-day Saints and made the city his home. While living in Salt Lake, he taught penmanship, drawing, and German at the University of Deseret (University of Utah).

He helped to establish many LDS-run schools throughout the Mountain West and in 1872, he made his way to Ogden. While living in the city, he became the principal and superintendent of schools in Weber County, leaving an indelible mark on the county. However, his largest contribution may be his stint from 1888-1892 and again from 1894-1902 as the first principal of Weber Stake Academy, which eventually grew to become Weber State University.

Moench guided the school through its first years and helped keep it afloat during difficult times. The Moench Building was the administrative and main classroom building for Weber when the college was located near downtown Ogden. There is a marker across from the Main Library branch of the Weber County Library to honor the building that has been lost to time. Moench's house, which he lived in beginning in 1896, still stands at 2631 Jefferson Avenue and two statues of the man appear throughout the city. The first statue, and possibly

more well-known one, is located on Weber's current campus on the northwest side. This bronze statue was commissioned to replace the other statue of Moench that can be found in Ogden.

The white marble bust of Louis Moench that used to stand at Weber is now located at his gravesite at the Ogden City Cemetery. It is visible from 20th street and, according to his son, does not adequately resemble Moench.

Moench died in 1916 and is buried at the Ogden City Cemetery.

## Frederick J. Kiesel

The other German man with an oversized impact on Ogden is Frederick J. Kiesel. Kiesel was born in the modern German state of Baden-Württemberg in the early 1840s. He arrived in Utah in 1863, settling first in Salt Lake City where he ran a freight and mercantile business. In 1872, three years after the arrival of the railroad to Ogden, he moved up to Corinne and eventually to Ogden to increase his business prospects. The railroad hub of Ogden was booming and Kiesel wanted in on the action.

Kiesel was a leader in the business community of Ogden. He was involved in Amalgamated Sugar, Ogden Packing & Provision, and Security State Bank. He also involved himself in many buildings throughout the city including the Hudson Building, which, still standing at the corner of 24th & Kiesel, was renamed to the Kiesel Building after his death.

While Kiesel lived in Ogden, there was tension between the Mormon and non-Mormon communities. Ogden was changing fast and Kiesel wanted to push it forward so he ran for mayor in 1889 on the Labor Party ticket, an anti-Mormon party that was established to counter the influence of the Mormon-dominated People's Party. The election brought Kiesel in as the first non-Mormon mayor of Ogden and many fellow Labor Party candidates were elected to the city council.

Perhaps Kiesel's largest mark on the city of Ogden is his renaming of the city streets. Before he was mayor, many of Ogden's streets were named after Mormon leaders. Kiesel was the man who "Americanized" the streets by having them all named after U.S. presidents. He also changed the

numbering of the streets to allow for further expansion of the city. 1st street through 8th street were renamed 21st to 28th respectively.

After his time as mayor, Kiesel continued to push for a more "non-LDS" version of Utah and the Mountain West. For example, one of his businesses offered mail-order liquor for dry counties in Idaho. Though he was strongly opposed to the dominant culture of the territory, he was still chosen for the Constitutional Convention for Utah when it gained statehood. This convention helped to write the Constitution of Utah and was made up of 107 delegates and included Ogden's first mayor, Lorin Farr.



Despite his influence on the city of Ogden as well as on the greater State of Utah, there are no statues or monuments to Kiesel like there are for Moench. He does have a street named after him as well as a building at 2423 Kiesel Ave but nothing like the remembrance for Moench. Kiesel died three years after Moench, in 1919, and was buried in Sacramento, California.

## Conclusion

These two men came from similar worlds and arrived in Ogden around the same time. They both reached the height of their impact on the city around the same time but had markedly different legacies. Even though neither of them were from Hof, Germany, it helps to frame the relationship that Ogdenites have had with Germany.

These two men's tension between religion and secularism helped fashion a pluralistic Ogden that exists to this day. Moench helped create and perpetuate education in the booming frontier town of Ogden while Kiesel helped create a more pluralistic city that could welcome Mormons and non-Mormons alike. Either way, they both loved the city dearly and tried to improve it the best way that they felt they could.

## Winning at Wintering

“We have seasons when we flourish and seasons when the leaves fall from us, revealing our bare bones.”

-Katherine May

Typically, I love the winter in Ogden. The snow-capped mountains change color hourly, the trees are coated in a scintillating layer of dewy frost, and the sky descends in a quiet fog as if coming down to visit me. The snow drowns out all unnecessary sound and paints the entire region with a monotone of gleaming white. Ogden itself feels peaceful, and I cherish my city’s invitation to slow down and rest.

But this season comes at a tremendous cost. At times, my days at home as I cozy up under several blankets next to a warm fire seem to decay, morphing into lonely afternoons as I doom scroll in my bed in the dark like a goblin. Time slows down in a bleary haze of monotony as my mood seems to gingerly progress downwards.

While medical conditions and environmental factors will play a heavy role in just how well each of us can win at wintering, our choices give us power to make the most of the cards we are dealt. Here are some of my recommendations for this winter, along with my reassurance that we will get through this season together.

### Watch the Dawn

When factoring cloud cover, Ogden receives, on average, 3.6 to 5.0 hours of sunshine per day in the winter months.<sup>1</sup> This light is critical to improving our moods, so during this season when sunlight is so sparse, collecting the benefits of it whenever we can is especially necessary. According to a 2012 study from the Journal of Nervous and Mental Disease, researchers found that each additional hour spent outside in natural light corresponded to mood improvements and general feelings of happiness<sup>2</sup>. When combining this to related studies that report both mood and cognitive benefits from exposure to sunlight as we wake up<sup>3</sup>, it can be reasonable to conclude that watching the dawn in the morning could be great meditative practice, allowing us to reap the benefits of sunlight even when conditions of sunlight are sparse.

### Return to an old hobby

According to Social Scientist Dr. Arthur C. Brooks, satisfaction is one of the three macronutrients of happiness. However, achieving brief moments of satisfaction does not always empower us to keep that emotional high once the feeling of accomplishment wears off. This sensation is often referred to as the “Hedonic Treadmill.” Author Hailey Magee offers recommendations to combat this cycle in her article “Why Success Stops Feeling Good: The Psychology of the Hedonic Treadmill.” In it, she recommends doing intrinsically motivated activities where your enjoyment comes from the activity itself, rather than activities where you gain joy from external validation. Sometimes when I start a new hobby, my mind slowly fills

with thoughts of comparison to my fellow hobbyists, or ideas about how this new skill I’m building could eventually be monetized. Soon enough, the motivation for my new activity fades until it is ultimately abandoned into the farthest corner of my largest closet. Returning to one of these hobbies gives us an opportunity to breathe a new life into it. We can enter a satisfactory “Flow State” as we begin to learn something new. If we intentionally refine our craft with nothing but present-moment enjoyment, we might find the passion that drew us to this new hobby in the first place once again.

### Build moments of enjoyment

Winter indulgences are my favorite gateways to enjoyment. In the co-authored book “Build the life you want”, Oprah Winfrey and Arthur Brooks write that “to obtain true enjoyment, that is, enjoyment that leads to feelings of happiness instead of fleeting moments of pleasure, we must pair our indulgences with other people and do so in ways that build memories.” This could mean exchanging another night of binge watching in our rooms with a glass of wine, to binge watching with our friends while sharing a bottle of wine and a cheese spread. This could mean exchanging a midnight chocolate bar when you can’t sleep to a midnight light-hearted conversation with your partner while making hot chocolate on the stove. This could mean exchanging an evening of reading into an online buddy read with your friend, swapping your favorite quotes until the moment you both collectively decide that this book is not for either of you.

### A Conclusion of Mindfulness

If there is one interweaving thread to this article, it’s that these practices are here to invite us to moments of mindfulness. In breathing icy air while watching small glows of sunlight rise over the Wasatch front, reconnecting with a hobby with the full intention of enjoying it for it’s own sake, or inviting our friends and family to join us as we romanticize our favorite winter activities together, we might find ourselves encouraged to truly take note of our present experiences, even in these slower, darker moments of our life like in an Ogden winter.

CSAs and local markets reconnect us with the people behind our food, not just the price tags.

#### 5. Stronger Communities

Local markets = community hubs. They're where neighbors meet, musicians play, and kids eat strawberries before Mom pays.

It fosters real connection in a time when digital "likes" are a poor substitute for human smiles.

#### 6. Resilience in a Time of Uncertainty

Global supply chains can break. Local farms adapt fast and keep food flowing.

In times of crisis, you don't want to rely on 1,200 miles of trucking and a trade war for your salad.

#### 7. Celebrate Local Flavor

Different regions grow different things. Local food reflects your area's seasonal rhythm and soul.

From Wasatch cherries to Weber Valley greens, local food tells a story that supermarket aisles never will.

#### 8. Create Local Jobs

Supporting local farms, shops, and co-ops creates employment for people right here.

Not bots, not offshore factories — your neighbors, your kids, your community.

Want to know if your strawberries are sprayed with chemicals? Ask.

## Becker Brewing Company: Beer, Rails, and the Rise of Industrial Ogden

Long before craft taps and tasting flights, before neon signs flickered along Historic 25th Street, Ogden was already humming with the sound of industry and few enterprises captured that energy more completely than the Becker Brewing and Malting Company.

Founded in the early 1890s by the Becker family along the banks of the Ogden River, the brewery would go on to become Utah's longest continuously operating brewery, running for more than seven decades and earning a reputation as one of the most important beer distributors in the American West.

### German Roots in a Railroad Town

The Becker story began with German immigrant John S. Becker and his sons, who took over a local brewing operation in Ogden and transformed it into a regional powerhouse.

Timing mattered. Ogden was already known as "Junction City," a railroad crossroads where goods and ambitions converged.

By the first decade of the twentieth century, Becker beer was traveling far beyond Utah. The company sold throughout Nevada, Idaho, Oregon, Colorado, Arizona, and California, with some shipments reaching as far as Illinois and Pennsylvania.

Production surged as demand grew. Around 1906 the plant expanded, eventually producing tens of thousands of barrels annually while operating its own waterworks, electric power system, and massive ice machinery to control fermentation temperatures.

Local barley, locally grown hops, and local craftsmen fueled the enterprise — making the brewery not just a manufacturer, but a major economic engine for Ogden itself.

### Rails, Ice, and the Birth of Regional Beer

To move that much beer required more than horses and wagons. Becker installed its own rail line to distribute product across neighboring states, a bold example of vertical integration at a time when industrial America was rapidly expanding westward.

### This strategy mirrored a national transformation already underway.

In the late 1800s, American brewers began adopting mechanical refrigeration and refrigerated railroad cars, allowing beer to travel farther without spoiling, a breakthrough that helped create the first national beer brands.

Early refrigerator cars were insulated with materials such as horse hair, shredded paper, and wood shavings; pre-cooled beer was loaded inside so it could stay cold in summer and avoid freezing in winter.

For western breweries like Becker, these technologies were revolutionary. Suddenly, geography mattered less. A brewery in Ogden could compete across state lines, riding the steel arteries of the railroad economy.

Beer had officially entered the age of mass transportation.

### Surviving Prohibition and Everything Else

When Prohibition threatened brew-

eries nationwide, Becker adapted rather than collapsed. Leadership shifted production to soft drinks and a cereal beverage called "Becco," while also bottling Coca-Cola products, manufacturing ice, and even launching a poultry-freezing business.

### Their resilience paid off.

When beer became legal again in the 1930s, Becker stood as the only operational brewery left in Utah.

Few companies anywhere could claim to have operated before, during, and after Prohibition, a distinction that cemented Becker's legacy in the state's industrial history.

### The Long Goodbye

Despite its durability, the postwar era brought new competition from massive national breweries whose scale and pricing power reshaped the industry. Becker ultimately closed in the early 1960s after roughly 75 years in business.

Yet its influence lingered, not just in brick foundations and archived labels, but in the memory of an Ogden that once brewed for the entire region.

### Legacy on the Landscape

At its height, observers noted that a city "three or four times the size of Ogden would be pleased to have such a brewery."

That line still echoes today.

### Because Becker was more than beer.

It was proof that Ogden strategically positioned on the rails could build industry powerful enough to

reach across the American West. And in many ways, that story is the story of Ogden itself:


A railroad town.



# LOCAL OGDEN BAND PROFILE

## floatingground

**The Etch A Sketch**, that magical drawing toy of the 1960s & 70s, captivated generations of children with two simple knobs and a blank white screen. Turn them one way, a line moves horizontally. Turn them another, vertically. Turn both at once, and with timing and just enough skill, circles begin to emerge. Entire worlds could be created inside that small frame, each one fragile and uniquely personal.

The process is arduous and tricky to get right. Hours and hours could be spent on a single portrait, like the Tibetan Monks' methodical mandalas which are also made patiently in a sand substance. The magic, however, wasn't just in the process of creating, or even in the creation itself, but in its impermanence. After admiring and perhaps sharing your masterpiece, you could shake the box and as the aluminum powder fell back into place, the canvas would return to blank. It was a clean slate: a quiet invitation to begin again.

These cycles of creativity remind us of life itself: drawing and erasing each chapter in our life as we live it, moment by moment. These moments leave no records of themselves except for the memories they leave behind. But even these memories are fleeting like whispers spoken in the wind.

A new and distinctive sound has risen from our valley, disrupting Ogden's music scene in the best possible way. Singer-songwriter Ether Warburton captures this idea vividly in floatingground's newest single, "TEA," released on Bandcamp before hitting all streaming platforms shortly after. In one of its most striking passages, they sing: *"I am the future and I am the past. I am the sudden realization that some things just don't last. I am the head that screams and the mouth that laughs, And the cold dark nights that you can't take back. I am the Etch A Sketch and the aluminum powder. I am the delete button and the do-over. I am the ending, and all that comes after. Every breath I take is the fucking rapture."*

Their lyrics carry a startling, raw declaration of identity. It's fragile and furious and transcendent all at once. Their band name itself, "floatingground," is defined as "untethered electricity."

The local Ogden band recently celebrated the release of their first full length album, "seventh sense," to a full house at Side Bar in autumn 2025.

At the heart of floatingground is Ether Warburton, a songwriter, lyricist, vocalist, and

acoustic guitarist, though Ether considers herself to be a poet most of all. She is the very definition of "electricity untethered." The "manifestations of words come in naturally and freely," she said..

Warburton writes constantly. They often begin writing without a defined theme, opening themselves up to the feelings they are experiencing in the moment. One of the band's earliest songs, "Honey," emerged from their grief after the loss of a partner years ago. Writing it became a form of therapy, and is a song they still play now. Over time, the song took on a life of its own, resonating with listeners, often meaning different things to different people. After all, once art is released, it belongs as much to the audience as it does to the creator.

The floatingground's sound is the result of true collaboration. Alongside the talented Warburton are Jon Abegglen as lead guitarist, Westley Renner on drums and production, and bassist Alek Burden, the newest band member. Their songs typically begin with Warburton's lyrics and basic structure, then evolve organically as each musician layers their sound into the arrangement.

I met the band for a wonderfully fun brunch at Two Bit Bistro on the first Sunday of February. Over exotic egg dishes, coffee, and mimosas, the conversation ranged from songwriting to philosophy to poetry to life in general. The laughter was constant; so was the intensity. The band fit their name perfectly as the energy around the table felt electric, curious, playful, and thoughtful all at once.

Their music brings these qualities all together, as that same electric energy comes through in both their live shows and their recorded songs. Their catalog includes their newest single, "TEA," the album "seventh sense" (2025), the single "Panicka" (2025), and their debut EP "Chasing Bunnies" (2024), on all major streaming and retail platforms. Their music is also on Bandcamp at [floatingground.bandcamp.com](https://floatingground.bandcamp.com).

The floatingground's lyrics are the heart of their music. They breathe their feelings to life, allowing the band's soul to express itself from the band to the listener. Warburton describes songwriting less as expression and more as discovery. "It's not about me," Ether states, "I learn from the expression."

The band's influences are wide-ranging. Warburton cites Fiona Apple as a major inspiration, along with Radiohead and Smashing

Pumpkins. Lead guitarist, Abegglen draws from jam bands and psychedelic rock. He names Modest Mouse and Led Zeppelin as some of his favorites. Burden's background includes ska and punk, with bands like Rancid shaping his style. Renner has been playing music since childhood and brings experience from school bands and choir with big instrumentals, drawing on influences like Stewart Copeland and The Police and genres like punk and metal.

The floatingground band describes itself as an alternative band, but their sound stretches from '90s radio rock and old school jam bands to modern indie. I also noticed a punk power in the heart of Ether's voice, and the band matches it perfectly.

Warburton's vocal delivery carries hints of Pat Benatar's power and Debbie Harry's cool defiance. When I mentioned this to Ether, they laughed and said they had never heard that comparison before, but welcomed it.

Punk's rawness comes from its stance of rebellion, vulnerability, and the belief that music can change the status quo. That spirit pulses through floatingground's work. Even the band's name reflects their philosophy. Styled in lowercase as a single word, floatingground, it merges "floating" and "ground," sharing one central "g." When asked how fans should remember it, Warburton offered a mischievous grin: "It's floatingground; one word, one g-spot. If you can't find it, that's both of our problems." The table erupted in laughter.

The floatingground band has a couple shows scheduled this spring, including an appearance on KRCL's "RadioActive Live" on March 27 and a performance at Funk n Dive on April 10. When the band isn't at one of your favorite local venues, know that they are all hard at work in the studio, with many songs to be released over the next year. For listeners seeking something authentic, unpredictable, and emotionally charged, this is a band worth following closely. floatingground offers music that feels hand-drawn, spontaneous and alive - like an Etch A Sketch masterpiece before the shake.
