
DEE SCHOOL - 441 20th Street built in 1905. This building is still standing. Now home of Lili Audrey's Health Spa.

MOUND FORT SCHOOL - 12th & Washington, 1905. Demolished 1976.
OGDEN HIGH SCHOOL right. (Now location of Central Middle School, 25th Street & Monroe ave). 1920. Demolished in the 1990s for a "modern" school.

CENTRAL SCHOOL - Ogden's high school 1890-1910. 25th & Grant (Now the site of the Utah State Court Building- demolished 1994)



FIVE POINTS SCHOOL - 1891 located on the northwest corner of 3rd & Adams Avenue. Demolished in 1970.




SOUTH WASHINGTON SCHOOL - 3279 Washington Blvd, built 1904. Demolished in 1990s, now a park.



PINGREE SCHOOL (left)- located 30th Street and Pingree Ave. 1892. Demolished in 1970. QUINCY SCHOOL (right) was located on 26th & Quincy Avenue. 1890. Demolished in 1942



WEBER ACADEMY - Now Weber State University- Located on 25th Street & Jefferson Aven. Gymnasium (left) still stands and is Golds Gym, formerly Desert Gym. Built in 1889 by the LDS Church.



SACRED HEART ACADEMY- 25th Street between Jackson/Quincy Built in 1902 and demolished 1950s

Peery's Egyptian Theater first opened on July 3rd, 1924. For 60 years, it was a palace of cinema. It closed in 1984 due to dwindling patrons; malls with their own theaters became popularized. Peery's Egyptian Theater didn't stay boarded up for long. After restoration it reopened on January 17th, 1997, to include a stage and become a community theater and performing arts center.

Now, 100 years after its original opening, Peery's is celebrating with a yearlong series of events. In January there was a gala that featured a historical overview of the theater and a performance from Ogden's own famous actress and singer, Marie Osmond.

February marked the beginning of a series of black and white films to be shown to honor the theater's history. Charlie Chapman's *The Kid* was first, with live music from Mike Ohman on Peery's irreplaceable Wurlitzer Organ. Then there was an in-concert version of *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*, with music from Ogden Chamber Orchestra. *Notre Dame* was one of the first films ever played at the theater. Other films shown in February are *It Happened One Night* and the silent short film *From Soup To Nuts*, with Dave Wickerham on the Wurlitzer Organ.

In March, the Ogden Chamber Orchestra performed an Egyptian piano concerto. There was also a documentary premiere—*History of Peery's Egyptian Theatre & History of Film in Ogden*—sponsored by Visit Ogden, the Utah Film Commission, and Weber State University's Film Studies Program. The premiere included a panel discussion, moderated by UFC director Virginia Pierce, and a silent short film accompanied by the Wurlitzer Organ.

Peery's Egyptian Theater is the crown jewel of Ogden. Patrons have been expressing their love through standing ovations and sold-out events. Kassi Bybee, General Manager, plans to schedule more days for plays and to showcase the "Mighty Wurlitzer." Bybee has been told the celebrations are "truly a love letter to theater." Check the list of upcoming events here and plan for unique experiences only available at Peery's Egyptian Theater. Tickets for all events are currently available.

EGYPTIAN THEATER 1924

Watch Like An Egyptian

There was a time when the magic of the silver screen was more than just special effects and stunts. It was a time when the theater itself was as much of a production as the movie, a time when the art of the theater rivaled that of the film.

Ogden became home to Peery's Egyptian Theater, one of the magnificent theaters of the age, in 1924. This year, our beloved theater is 80 years old, and the celebration has begun!

Peery's Egyptian Theater on Washington Boulevard was built in the boom of America's picture palaces. The influx of construction of these extravagant theaters was due largely in part to the City Beautiful movement, which was a progressive reform movement in American history in the 1890s and 1900s with the "intent of using beautification and monumental grandeur in cities to control perceived moral decay of poverty-stricken urban environments," according to Wikipedia, an online encyclopedia.

According to *The Egyptian Theater, A History* written for the Ogden City Landmarks Commission in 1988 by Aegerter, Comarell, and Haws, "It was the first time in American history where a great group of public buildings were specifically designed to delight and impress the citizen-visitor and to fulfill their every need. The picture palaces of the late 1910s and 1920s were created to make the place one viewed movies as exciting and

memorable as seeing the movie itself."

The Egyptian Theater did just that. The theater opened in 1924 and was built by former Ogden Mayor Harman Peery and his brother Louis for \$250,000. According to *The Egyptian Theater, A History*, the Peery boys and their mother Latitia put a great amount of work into the theater prior to its opening, including everything from research of Egyptian ornamentation to testing the comfort of seats for the theater. A great effort was made to hire Ogden businesses to work on the project and construction was done in less than one year. On opening night of July 3, 1924, the city of Ogden was given the great gift of Peery's Egyptian Theater. The extravagant picture palace opened with Zane Grey's *Wanderers of the Wasteland*.

Brett Hullinger reported in *Salt Lake Magazine* "Opening night patrons, who paid a dollar plus war tax to attend the festivities, were met by an other-worldly facade. Sculpted Egyptian deities sat cross-legged on the roof. Brightly colored hieroglyphics covered the interior of the foyer and auditorium. It was as if the banks of the Nile had been transported to downtown Ogden."

But that's not all. Amongst the mighty music from the Wurlitzer Hope-Jones pipe organ, the Egyptian Theater unveiled an atmospheric ceiling, which had the ability to replicate the sky from sunrise to a star-lit night. Today, the Egyptian is home to one of only 10 remaining atmospheric ceilings in the United States.

That evening, *The Egyptian Theater, A History* reports that Ogden Mayor P.F. Kirkendall said, "I hope that it is the first step toward a city

beautiful."

The theater did bring great joy to the community for years and went through several owners and renovations. Much of the original artwork was painted over and some architectural changes were made. In 1959, the original pipe organ was removed. After years of neglect, it was closed down in 1984 and almost torn down twice. A group of concerned and dedicated citizens came together and formed the group Friends of the Egyptian Theater to raise awareness about the value of the theater for the community and to raise money to ensure it stayed standing in Ogden for all to enjoy.

After years of hard work, the theater was saved. Utah legislation records state "through a five-way partnership consisting of Weber County, Ogden City, Weber State University, the Egyptian Theater Foundation, and the Ogden/Weber Chamber of Commerce, Peery's Egyptian Theater was saved and restored."

The theater and its new owners ventured on a \$7.5 million restoration project that was completed in 1997. The theater won two national awards for the restoration and is now designated as a historic landmark on the National Register of Historic Places. Largely due to its role in providing an exquisite showcase of the arts for the community, many call the Egyptian Theater the gem of downtown Ogden.

It is the theater's 80th birthday this year, and after all of the priceless history, hard work and wonderful times we've had at the Egyptian, it is time to celebrate!

The Egyptian has unveiled a




Harmon Peery and Lewis H. Peery, Founders of Egyptian Theater

special season in honor of their 80 years from September continuing through the end of the year. One of the most electrifying parts of the celebration is the long-awaited completion of the Egyptian's new mighty Wurlitzer pipe organ! It has taken eight years and over \$2 million to restore and complete, but the theater finally has a mighty organ to accompany its films once again. Watching a silent film graced by a Wurlitzer organ, just like the old days, is an experience you shouldn't miss as there is nothing quite like the show.

The Egyptian has provided a showcase of the arts for Ogden for the last 80 years. As for the next 80 years, Narlene Mathie, manager of the Egyptian Theater, said, "I hope we continue to grow as a booming venue for the arts. But most importantly, we need the support of the community for the theater to continue to exist. We were originally called 'the show place of the West' and as we've meticulously restored the theater and continually work to entertain the community, we hope to bring this hidden treasure to everyone again." Please come and join the community in celebrating the 80th birthday of one of Ogden's most treasured community pillars.



Union Station Celebrates 100 Years as the Heart of Ogden

In 2024, Ogden is recognizing its most iconic building: Union Station is turning 100 in 2024. Leading up to the anniversary, the Museums at Union Station are presenting a year-long series of celebrations. Ogdenites young and old will be able to participate in activities, festivals, and educational opportunities, which started in November 2023.

The Museums at Union Station have many festivities in the works. On November 22, 2023—the station's 99th birthday—a new exhibit commemorating Union Station opened with a ribbon-cutting ceremony in the Station's Grand Lobby. The exhibit features interviews of sixteen Ogdenites impacted by Union Station. Throughout 2024, events open to all community members will commemorate the Station's 100-year milestones. Events will include the first ticket sold at the station and the laying of the first bricks. The highlight of the year will be the 100 Year Celebration on November 22-23, 2024.

“Union Station has created the Ogden we know today,” said Hope Eggett, the curator of the Museums at Union Station. “It’s hard to over-emphasize the impact of Union Station on the people of Ogden. With the centennial anniversary, we hope Ogdenites will be proud of Union Station and Ogden’s history.”

Ogden's first train station was built in 1870 following the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad. In 1889, the building was replaced with a much larger building capable of hosting Ogden's railroad passengers. The building was destroyed by fire in 1923. The current Union Station building was built in 1924 and hosted regular train traffic through 1971. Since 1978, the Station has hosted museums and community events at Ogden's heart.

Supporters of the Union Station Centennial year include Ogden City, Weber County RAMP, the Utah Division of Arts and Museums, and the Union Station Foundation.

OGDEN'S NEW DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

WONDERBLOCK DEVELOPMENT

Located along 26th Street between Grant and Lincoln Avenues, the proposed WonderBlock development is a unique mixed-use, lifestyle centric, experience led project located in the heart of Downtown Ogden, connecting directly to Historic 25th Street.

Ogden has always held onto its history wherever possible. Union Station, Peery's Egyptian Theater, and 25th Street are just a few examples. On 26th Street between Lincoln and Grant Avenues, Ogden used to have a Wonder Bread factory. When Hostess declared bankruptcy in 2012, the factory was forced to close its doors. The building was later demolished in 2018. Until recently, the 5.9 acres of land had remained empty for years despite its location in the heart of downtown Ogden.

Ogden City hadn't created any city development plans in at least a decade. This large time gap has led to a lack of overall growth for the city. In 2020, Ogden City finally changed this and adopted the Make Ogden Downtown Master Plan, which will roll out in phases over time. The ambitious master plan spans 25 years and covers multiple projects that are meant to grow Ogden's economy and increase attractiveness. Through this plan, the city aims to provide more jobs, better transportation, and greater housing options. There will also be new unique venues, restaurants, and stores.

The six tenets of the plan are: real estate & land use; historic

& cultural assets; transportation & mobility; open space & parks; and social equity & essential services. The implementation of these tenets will be through projects like WonderBlock, policy changes, programs to generate revenue, partnerships with private and public entities, and both private and public funding.

One of the projects for the first phase of the Make Ogden plan has recently made visible headway. The city is finally utilizing the once vacant Wonder Bread lot. WonderBlock broke ground on February 9th, 2024. Ogden officials have stated they expect the project will take around four years to complete. In alignment with the tenets of the Make Ogden plan, WonderBlock's name is preserving the history of the old building that once occupied the land.

WonderBlock is advertised on Ogden City's website as a mixed-use development. The website claims it will have 354 high amenity residential units, all within walking distance of downtown businesses and events. Additionally, WonderBlock will have approximately 100,000 square feet of office space, 50,000 square feet of retail space, 20,000 square feet of gro-

cery store space, pedestrian pathways, public outdoor amenity spaces, and a boutique hotel.

This one-of-a-kind project represents an investment total of roughly \$188,000,000, being funded by a partnership between Ogden City Redevelopment Agency and J. Fisher Companies. The city does not plan on raising property taxes to pay for the development of WonderBlock. Instead, they plan to shift toward paid parking in the downtown area. WonderBlock will have two parking garages with around 1,134 parking spaces combined. After a free parking period, a paid parking system will commence.

Ogden City has hosted numerous public information events regarding the Make Ogden Downtown Master Plan. 


The public is invited to an opening reception outside the Union Station at 5 pm. At 6 pm inside the Union Station's Browning Theater, guests will hear from speakers on the history and meaning of the car, as well as Utah's leaders on its significance. Live music and light refreshments will follow the speakers. The museums host the Utah State Archives showcasing artifacts that originally accompanied Utah's Merci Car as gifts to the people of Utah.

"Union Station is honored to be home to Utah's Merci Car and to bear the responsibility of sharing its story with the next generation," said curator of the Museums at Union Station Hope Eggett, "Its lessons of friendship, shared humanity, sacrifice, and service are universal."




The Utah Merci Car was originally part of the Merci Train. In 1947, Ogden hosted the "Friendship Train," a nationwide grassroots effort to send food and aid to the people of France following World War II. In response, the Merci Train, or "Gratitude Train," was sent by the people of France in 1949. It consisted of 49 boxcars, dedicated to individual U.S. states, filled with gifts from French citizens. Utah's boxcar was presented on February 22, 1949 to Utah's leadership. Making this especially meaningful, "40 & 8" boxcars like Utah's Merci Car were used to transport troops around France during World War I and II.



The Utah Merci Car will be undergoing preservation efforts starting in Spring 2024 at an off-site location. It will come back in its 1949 colors and emblems. Funding for the Merci Car restoration project is by Ogden City and the Union Station Foundation.

The funding for this event is made possible through Weber County RAMP, Ogden City, and the Utah Division of Arts and Museums.

HEMP HYSTERIA

Newfound Knowledge Presents: Jack and the Hempstalk

Silver and gold have never been greener! Or shall we say money does grow on trees? Industrial hemp, *Cannabis Sativa L.*, is the cash crop we need and once had. The debate is multi-faceted but first, a science lesson. Only in the genus *Cannabis* do we find the unique class of compounds called cannabinoids. THC is the psychoactive ingredient of *Cannabis* while CBD is antipsychoactive. One type of *Cannabis*, a.k.a. marijuana, is high in THC and low in CBD. However, industrial types of hemp, which all fit in the *Cannabis Sativa L.* category have a reverse ratio. *Cannabis* with THC below 1.0 percent and a CBD/THC ratio greater than one is not capable of inducing a psychoactive effect.

Industrial hemp has always been around. Other countries are growing it by the ton as you read. It is just us here in the United States where we have forgotten yesterday. Hemp stores, online and live, sell hemp products: cosmetics, lotions, shoes, clothing—want a hemp tie? —industrial paints and oils, ropes, paper, etc. New printing presses are researching ways to use hemp paper with economical and environmental benefits. The plant we used through hundreds of years of war, peace, and prosperity is back with countless uses! A dark shroud has covered our eyes for more than 70 years. The possibilities of where we could be today if in the 1930s we hadn't been misled are intriguing.

I must give proper credit for most of the information in this article. What you are learning has been qualified and gathered by various researchers, the primary being Jack Herer, author of "The Emperor Has No Clothes." He claims the data can be found in Federal and State Department of Agriculture reports, articles from Popular Mechanics, Popular Science, Pulp & Paper Magazine, Scientific American, entries from encyclopedias/pharmacopoeias, and studies from all over the world during the last 200 years. His \$100,000 challenge in that book is to find the solution for this scenario: If fossil fuels and all by-products, as well as trees for paper and construction, were banned in order to safeguard the planet, there is only one known natural resource capable of providing the majority of the world's paper, textiles, transportation, industrial, and home energy needs, while simultaneously reducing pollution, rebuilding the soil and cleaning the atmosphere.



Did the Garden of Eden have Cannabis?

Hemp can grow anywhere if not The Garden. From near Arctic temperatures to high mountaintops, the plant grows with weed-like speed but in the process provides shade to prevent real weeds from growing. Hemp root systems anchor to a depth of 12 inches in 30 days and as far down as 6 feet when full grown. This, of course, pulverizes and aerates the ground for the next rotational crop. The genetics of the cannabis plant make for a plant that "cleans" or soaks up heavy-metal contaminants from soil, gradually purifying the earth and purging the contaminants from fossil fuel smelting, oil refining, and even papermaking mills. Over a period of three months the entire plant reaches tree-like heights of 10 to 14 feet. Some strains climb as high as 20 feet. This allows, of course, for longer fibers, stronger fabrics and thus longer lasting products. Furthermore, harvesters have found one acre of hemp produces an amount of pulp equivalent to that of 4.1 acres of trees.

Brief, Macrocosmic Highlights of Hemp History

Scholars believe the early Chinese art of hemp papermaking was one of the two reasons that Oriental knowledge and science were vastly superior to that of the West for 1,400 years.

This art of papermaking made record keeping easier and thus scholarship and education more attainable. Hemp knowledge improved and spread.

The plant became a crucial part of the agriculture in Asia, the Middle East, and eventually

Europe. Early doctors, herbalists, and healers discovered the medicinal uses and nutritional values of the plant. During this time, ships with hemp sails—they lasted longer in the salty conditions—and cargo perpetuated the lucrative commodity in new areas, including the New World. Even as the separatists settled and began to break ground, laws required the first North American colonists to grow cannabis hemp, which they had brought from Europe. In fact, to encourage the growing of the plant, government permitted colonists to pay their taxes with hemp and in general the plant was accepted as a rudiment in bartering. George Washington, 150 years later in colonial America, when he wasn't off protecting or leading the nation, kept a journal of his hemp husbandry. Thomas Jefferson believed in its efficiency to the point he smuggled rare hemp seed strains from Europe for American farmers. He invented the first U.S. patented machine, the hemp break, a device for making harvesting easier.

Hemp surpluses in backfields and storage areas appeased Revolutionary War debts. Even tobacco, which leaves soil barren of nutrients after harvesting, could not keep up with Cannabis. The War of 1812 takes on a whole new meaning when one understands why it was fought. The international espionage and intrigue of the war, mostly fought in Europe, involved Russian-grown hemp, considered the best in the world at that time. Trade embargoes, naval blockades, spies, Napoleon, and Russian hemp are all factors in that war with global ripples.

The Industrial Revolution meets Cannabis Sativa L.

Another 100 years later, in 1916, 50-year-old German immigrant George W. Schlichten finally invented the decorticator. His expertise in forestry and plant fibers translated into a collection of blades, belts and gears that stripped the fiber out of plants, with hemp specifically in mind. Investor Henry Timken, ambitious and with his ear to the ground for new opportunity, went to meet George in February of 1917. Timken saw the potential for a world changing invention and promptly arranged for 100 acres of hemp to be grown on his ranch in Imperial Valley in order to test the machine and its output.

Enter the scene, E.W. Scripps and partner Milton McRae. Scripps owned the largest chain of newspapers in the country. Facing an extreme shortage of paper supply because of World War I, the search for an alternative paper source was tantalizing to these men, enough that Scripps requested his partner look into the possibility of converting to the decorticator.

The businessmen were thoroughly impressed, not only with Schlichten, but with the quality of the product as well and the amount of money they could save. During this time, mogul Scripps, back in his office, was thinking of other ways to deal with the problem instead of fixations on a lone German farmer and his contraption. In the end, he simply raised the cost of his newspaper by one cent to avoid losing his entire year's profits and dropped the idea of using the fiber-stripping machine. Nobody would hear of it again until the 1930s.

Popular Mechanics Magazine boasted the headline "New Billion-Dollar Crop" in February 1938. Exactly one year earlier, Mechanical Engineering Magazine stated "The Most Profitable & Desirable Crop That Can Be Grown". Both headlines referred to hemp. It was the first time any product had been given such a challenge or designation, and the decorticator, designed more than a decade before, was the machine to make these headlines prophetic. Both articles explained precisely

how the machine worked. For the readers it must have been like discovering the cotton gin or printing press all over again. Hemp farmers read these articles ecstatically. For years they had dreamed of using all the plant in more bulk, for less manpower. The decorticator wasn't doing anything new, just better. Hundreds of tons could now be processed in days instead of weeks. Further, previous systems left unused plant hurds or shavings of the inner bark; this was the major substance of the wood and home furnishing products derived from cannabis.

The Conspiracy Theory of the Century

Now, imagine this. A prominent and wealthy newspaper mogul (William Randolph Hearst) has stock in large amounts of forest for his own publications and hears of the hemp decorticator. Jazz and swing are the in; America is booming and climbing an upward spiral during the 20s. Hemp hysteria threatens the system and product that have always brought him his wealth. Others stood to lose millions as well, like Lammont Du Pont, president of the Du Pont Company. Not only was it supplying chemicals to the paper industry (Hearst) but also it was in the thick of fossil fuel processing and research. Chemists had recently found the means to make fuel additives, various synthetic products such as nylon, cellophane, and plastics, all out of the unscathed supply of fossil fuels. The choice was made and the players preserved what they had. Hearst, in his own papers, began to term the word marijuana for the very first time. The propaganda, posters, film, and slogans linked vicious rapes, murders, and robberies to a noxious weed from the South. In most cases, African-American men or Mexican immigrants were linked as the user and abuser. The public was astonished at the newfound "disease" and took action, eradicating it under the name marijuana. This was the propaganda name given to hide the real identity of the plant. Nobody seemed to know that as we were passing laws against marijuana, we were passing them against a "billion dollar" crop and solution to many human ailments.

After the 1937 Marijuana Tax Law, new Du Pont "plastic fibers," under license since 1936 from the German company I.G. Farben (patent surrenders were part of Germany's World War I reparation payments to America), replaced natural hempen fibers. This is the story—in raw brevity—omitted from history books, modified in the law archives, and hidden from the people. Industrial hemp is not a great mystery or new notion to some. Although the World War II generation is dying away, the wager is that most of them would be able to remember the days of hemp fields and gardens grown freely.

The last gasping days of hemp, when it was still promoted by the U.S. government, happened during World War II. "Hemp for Victory," a 14-minute United States Department of Agriculture film (1942), showed Midwestern farmers growing hemp for the world cause. Most military fatigues were sewn with a majority of hemp thread. Ropes and mooring for ships in World War II—not just the War of 1812—were made of hemp to resist the elements. A hemp parachute even saved George Bush during WWII when he was shot down over the Pacific.

In comic books and movie lore, we often worry about powerful creations falling into the wrong hands. Worse in our day is when powerful ideas or devices are erased from our memory and past completely. However, crusaders are making sure we realize what we had before and could lose for good. The hemp movement is rising from the underground and waking the present populace to giant hemp stalks growing in our future, if we want them.




